




Map 1. The Limestone Massif of northern Syria. Study Area





Map 2. Villages of origin of migrants as known from the inscriptions of the diaspora





Map 3. Monasteries and presses in the northern Limestone Massif




Map 4. Distribution of dated inscriptions up to AD 250





Map 5. Distribution of dated inscriptions, AD 250-350




Map 6. Distribution of dated inscriptions, AD 350-450

Appendix 2. A database of dated inscriptions from the Limestone Massif

Ordered by name of collection as cited in the text

How to access the database

This CD contains a database of 434 Greek, Latin and Syriac inscriptions from the Limestone Massif of northern Syria. Most of these texts are dated, though ca. 50 undated texts have also been included due to the relevance of their contents. All of the inscriptions from the Limestone Massif which are discussed in the body of this thesis may be found here.

The database has been created by using FileMaker Pro 11, a software published by Filemaker, Inc., a subsidiary of Apple, Inc. The user will need to install this software in order to consult the database. A 30-day trial copy may be downloaded from http://info.filemaker.com/Us_en_FileMaker_Pro_11_Trial.html.




Fig.1. Searching the database. The ‘Find’ mask may be accessed by selecting ‘Find’ and ‘Create New Find’ (circled in red). The full-body search may be performed by entering a keyword (Greek and Syriac supported) in the search field in the top right corner (circled blue).

The epigraphic database may be navigated by using the layout ‘Inscriptions’ (Fig.2). Searches may be performed either by using the “Find” function, which allows searches by individual fields, or by performing a full-body search (Fig.1).

Fig.2. The ‘Inscriptions’ layout. The table contains three different sets of data: information pointing to the corpus/publication where the inscription is published (fields ‘Collection’ and ‘Concordance’) and the language of the inscription (‘Language’); information on where the inscription was found, including the modern and ancient toponym of the findspot (‘Transliterated’, ‘Arabic’, ‘Ancient’), the sub-region where the inscription was found (‘Jebel’), the ancient city territory in which this area lay (‘Territory’) and, finally, the actual findspot for the inscription (‘Findspot’). The rest of the table contains data specifically on the inscription, specifying the type of text (‘Inscr. Type’), the text of the inscription in the original and in translation (‘Text’ and ‘Commentary’, which also include the apparatus and notes) and keywords related to its content (‘Keywords’). Finally, the year and month to which the inscription is dated (‘Year’, ‘Month’ and the related fields ‘Period’ and ‘Century’).
